1. The beach is open and has been open daily, and will have full staff this week and has run very smooth with one Save from the Lifeguard staff already.
2. The Arrowhead Park Rest Rooms went online with the new sewer plant on July 1<sup>st</sup>.  
Town Hall on July 2<sup>nd</sup>
3. Preparations for the fireworks, Symphony, and Ping Pong drop are all on track for a great 4th of July week.
4. We still have an issue with sidewalk and pillar lights that we are trying to work out, it may need a whole new underground service wire pulled as it was cut several times last fall while installing the Sewer pipes. We have repaired with the help of Lutz Mechanical several times this past month but they keep burning out with all of this moist weather.
5. Water tests for Town Hall Arrowhead and Fern go to the DOH via Verona Labs July 9<sup>th</sup>.
6. Plans have been made to build Seat shelves and Lockers in the coach's cabin during the week of July 8<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>.
7. The Parks Staff gave the dugouts a fresh coat of paint.
8. As the regular maint. Duties of the staff for summer influx of visitors has now arrived we will be moving a bit slower on some of our ongoing projects but with the aid of mother nature the guys are a bit ahead of the summer extra punch list as is.

## Information Office Report                      of the month June 2013

1. **Next newsletter deadline will be 5:00 PM on Wednesday, September 11.**  
This newsletter will cover the months of October, November & December.
2. Balance in Petty Cash on June 30 was \$47.85.
3. 13 information packets were sent out of this office during the month of June.
4. From June 1 to June 30 this office processed 0 preseason snowmobile permits.
5. As of June 30 this office has collected \$4,835 for “Arts in the Park” (58 vendors) and \$2,045 for Fall Festival (32 vendors).
6. The next CAA meeting is scheduled for 7:30am on August 7 in the Town of Webb Board Room. I did not see a July meeting posted.
7. Black Fly Challenge was great. Thank you to Shawn Hansen, John Frey, Tim Brownsell & Bill Faro for showing up at Fern Park the day before to make sure the finish line was safe and ready. We had a record number of entries with 578 and 508 finishers! Only about 6 of these were DFNs (Did Not Finish), so this means 70 people who had registered did not show up race day, maybe because of the weather forecast? We (AMBA & ASE) are already meeting and planning for 2014’s race, which will start in Inlet on June 14<sup>th</sup>.
8. Adirondack Memory Walk did well. The new route to Drake’s along the Elaine Townsend Trail was a nice change. Patty can tell you how much money this event took in. We still have visors for sale from this event. The money raised at this event seems to get less each year. We may consider adding an activity to next year’s walk to encourage better attendance.
9. I Love NY is giving Indian Lake money for banners to promote the Adirondack Challenge. They are having one made for Inlet that I told them we could hang on the tennis courts, like we do for Black Fly Challenge. They wanted to put one across the road, but the Adirondack Challenge is the same weekend as “Arts in the Park.” The one for the tennis courts will be 3’ x 10’.
10. SS Minnow will begin running on July 5<sup>th</sup>, and will run 8 pm – 2 am every Friday & Saturday until August 31<sup>st</sup>. Penny dropped off a check for \$2,000 out of her personal account towards this. I have heard a few promises from the bars I sent letters to (North Woods, Red Dog), but I have only received money from the following:

There will be a bouncy house, Inlet ambulance will offer free blood pressure checks, and the Inlet fire trucks will be on display. Inlet PTP will be doing a car wash, the Cousins That Care will have a booth, and the Equine Rescue League of Cooperstown will have a lemonade stand.
