Parks Department Report for December 2016

1. We have had pretty decent snow for grooming at both Fern Park and the Inlet Golf Course. Both locations have seen good use and the lit Loop is open for Night skiing.
2. The Rink at Fern Park has opened but has been forced to close several days due to warmer weather and unsatisfactory ice conditions. Even when flooding is done at midnight or 5AM sometimes the air temperatures this season have thwarted us.
3. Demolition for Cottage #4 Broad Band Project is nearly complete. During the first two weeks of Jan. The Parks Staff expects to start the remodel to prep for final construction. Bore drilling and wire pulls from street to #4 & to Town Hall will commence next week.
4. Regular Water samples were sent out for December to close out 2016.
5. With some larger projects on the horizon I have again written to Mid State for Prisoner maint. Care on Arrowhead Park.

1. The Inlet Lamp Lighter is still on hold.
2. Balance in Petty Cash on December 31st was \$18.70.
3. From April 1, 2016 to December 31, 2016 this office has processed 565 snowmobile permits for the 2016/17 season: 328 Preseason, 202 Seasonal, 5 Weekday, 26 Weekly, 1 Upgrade, 3 Replacement. Old Forge processed 8,622: 6,421 Preseason, 1908 Seasonal, 37 Weekday, 185 Weekly, 4 Upgrade, 55 Replacement, 12 Snofest? Total permits for both towns compared to last year listing last year's number first: 7,217/6,749 Preseason, 471/2,110 Seasonal, 42/42 Weekday, 1/211 Weekly, 0/5 Upgrade, 17/58 Replacement. Total of 1,427 more transactions this year.
4. On December 1st, applications for the 2017 Fall Festival were sent to the vendors who stayed both days in 2016 giving them the chance to reserve their space from last year. On January 1st applications for 2017 "Arts in the Park" and Fall Festival were made available online and an email was sent to those who wished to receive by email. Paper applications will be mailed to those who requested them on January 3rd and vendors will then be accepted first come, first served. During the 2016 "Arts in the Park," \$3,080 was collected from 36 vendors to reserve 38 ½ spaces in the 2017 show. During December, \$610 was collected from 10 vendors to reserve 10 spaces in the 2017 Fall Festival.
5. The performers are all booked for the 2017 "Sunsets by the Lake" Concert Series. You can find the list at www.inletconcertseries.com. I have received notice from ALCA that the Town of Inlet will be awarded \$750 from the DEC Regrant Program.
6. The IABA will meet on January 3rd at 6:00 p.m. at Screamen Eagle. You do not have to own a business to become a member of IABA, and you do not have to be a member to participate.
