

Regular Meeting  
Town Board  
May 9, 2017

Present were Gary Zawatski, Aimee VanWie, Shawn Hansen,  
Andrew Kalil, Dave Scranton

Officials present were Councilman Levi, Councilman Brownsell,  
Councilman Schmid, Supervisor Frey, Patty Wittmeyer, Town Clerk  
Councilman Faro was absent.

The meeting began with the Pledge of Allegiance at 7:30pm led by  
Supervisor Frey.

The minutes from the April 11 and 24<sup>th</sup> meeting required no changes.

#### Public Comment

Gary Zawatski asked about the Legion building concerning the changes in its  
appearance. It was explained that it was purchased from the Legion and is being  
remodeled now by the new owners. He also asked if there was any "Main Street"  
grants in the future as he was thinking of doing work on his building. Supervisor  
Frey reported that support for this project is being asked through IABA  
correspondence with shop owners to see if any would be interested in this grant  
opportunity.

#### Reports Online

The monthly reports from Parks, Information, Police and Youth Commission are  
online.

It was noted that some issues with the Wastewater Treatment Plant had occurred  
due to use of Drano. Letters were sent to the District residents, discouraging them  
from using caustic agents, which can be tracked back to the residence.

#### POLICE

Supervisor Frey spoke of the support resolution needed for Police Consolidation  
that was approved of at the April 24<sup>th</sup> special meeting. It needed to be on the Senate  
docket for passage. It was also passed at the County level and Town of Webb.

Supervisor Frey then read a letter of retirement from Chief Andrew Kalil, effective  
May 30, 2017. He has been a police officer for 31 years. The board accepted his  
letter, thanked him for his years of service and dedication to this Town.

#### PLANNING BOARD

The committee is waiting for the final draft review of the vendor permit ordinance.

#### HIGHWAY

Spring cleanup around town is taking place. Branches from the winter storm were picked up and chipped. Sidewalk sweeping is still being done throughout town. Weight restrictions are still in place. The Moose River Plains is gated, to be open before Memorial Day weekend. The replacement of sidewalks (900 feet) will be done within the next week in several spots along Route 28.

#### TRANSFER STATION

Summer hours are in effect, closed from 12-1 for lunch. Dump stickers should be picked up from the Clerk's office.

#### CAP-21

Information concerning the Main Street Grant has been given to the IABA in hopes that businesses will want to participate. Nick Rose of CAP-21 has details on this grant. Final plans for the foundation design of the pavilion in Arrowhead Park are almost completed.

#### YOUTH COMMISSION

Quotes for the resurfacing of the Tennis Courts were received to Mary. Prices of \$19,842 and \$19,600. Super Seal Sealcoating LLC., from Penfield was the lowest quote.

#### RESOLUTION NO: 27.17 TENNIS COURTS

On a motion offered by Councilman Levi, seconded by Councilman Schmid the following resolution was ADOPTED by VOTE to approve the resurfacing of the tennis courts in Arrowhead Park at a cost not to exceed \$19,600.

#### TOWN CLERK

A revenue report for cottage rentals was given, for the month of April, \$2700.00 was received.

#### SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

It was reported that a county grant for emergency service tower might be located within the County.

Update on the DANC fiber lines being installed has Inlet with new service for the Fire/Police/Library/School and Town Hall. The loop from Blue Mountain to Utica and back will give a huge savings in utilities for the Town.

The Tupper Lake grant for the purchase of a canoe/kayak dock at the end of 6<sup>th</sup> Lake road can now get underway. A committee has been formed to decide on exact size and placement of this dock that will be handicap accessible. The Hudson River/Black River Authority will need to be part of this decision.

PUBLIC COMMENT

A moment of silence was observed due to the passing of Raymond Norkus, former Councilman on the Town Board, a contributor to the Master Plan, and resident of Inlet for many years.
