1. Work on the Arrowhead Park cleanup is ongoing and we would like to thank the Highway for providing us a bin.
2. The Arrowhead Ball field has been hit yet again with a plague of Grubs treatment is ongoing.
3. The Toro workman Buggy got a facelift and a new belt.
4. Water is on in the cottages for cleaning purposes and our Park wide and Cottage water tests go out on the 9th of May with a May 24th open date on bathhouse and Cottages as per the shock treatments and 15-day wait from test dates.
5. New Grills for the park have been secured and will be in place soon.
6. Tennis court resurface company was on site for a visit on 5/2/17 and will let us know a week before they arrive.
7. Our hope is to be complete with the siding on the Bath extension by Memorial day for our Parade visitors.

Information Office Report

of the month April 2017

1. The Inlet Lamp Lighter is still on hold.
2. Balance in Petty Cash on March 31 was \$22.70.
3. From April 1, 2017 to April 30, 2017 this office has processed 0 snowmobile permits for the 2017/18 season. During March, this office sold 18 permits for the 2017/18 season at the preseason rate of \$65. The Information Office will continue to sell 2017/18 Snowmobile Permits for the preseason rate of \$65 each until November 15, 2017. Permits can also be purchased at the Town of Webb Visitor Center and online at OldForgeNY.com. Stickers will be printed some time in September and will be then be mailed to anyone who has purchased one prior to printing.
4. During the 2016 "Arts in the Park," \$3,080 was collected from 36 vendors to reserve 38 ½ spaces in the 2017 show. During December, \$730 was collected from 12 vendors to reserve 12

spaces in the 2017 Fall Festival. Since January 1st, we have collected an additional \$800 from 10 vendors to reserve 10 spaces for “Arts in the Park” and \$700 from 10 vendors to reserve 13 spaces at Fall Festival. Applications and a list of vendors signed up can be found at www.inletartsinthepark.com and www.inletfallfestival.com. Keeping track of number of vendors now that insurance is required: Last year/this year on this date “Arts in the Park” 61/46 & Fall Festival 37/22.

5. The IABA will hold their Spring Social on May 10th at Mulligan’s. Cocktails and hors d’oeuvres start at 6:00 with a brief meeting around 7:00 and social ends at 9:00. Everyone is welcome – need not be a member. They are currently collecting dues for 2017. RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE TOWNS OF WEBB & INLET REQUESTING A CHANGE IN
NEW YORK STATE LAW ALLOWING FOR THE CONSOLIDATION OF ADJOINING POLICE
DEPARTMENTS IN SEPARATE COUNTYS

Whereas, financial pressures on local government budgets are forcing municipalities to examine how they deliver their services, and

Whereas, the Governor of New York State has encouraged all local governments to find efficiencies and reduce the number of agencies wherever possible, and

Whereas, the Towns of Webb and Inlet in Herkimer and Hamilton counties are currently engaged in formal discussions regarding the possibilities of consolidating police protection services, and

Whereas, current New York State law does not contain a provision allowing Towns to consolidate police departments across county lines, and

Whereas, the communities believe it is now appropriate to explore this opportunity for enhanced efficiencies in municipal service delivery, and

Whereas, the elected officials and staff of both Towns have had a longstanding practice of working together to resolve mutual problems, and

Whereas, the Towns of Webb and Inlet Police departments have had an inter-agency agreement in place allowing for shared policing, they still have duplicated staffing as in separate Police Chiefs and equipment needs that could be streamlined, and

Whereas, the Town Supervisors, Police Chiefs, and designated Town Board members serving on a jointly formed committee have been holding monthly meetings open to the public, and

Whereas, the Towns have gone as far as they can without New York State legislative approval passed in both the Assembly and Senate then signed into law by the Governor, and

Whereas, both Towns believe that the aforementioned issue can be resolved with support from Our New York State legislative bodies and the Governors office.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the Towns of Webb and Inlet in Herkimer and Hamilton counties request the same consolidation privileges across shared county lines that those within county lines enjoy under New York State law.

INLET WATER RESOURCE RECOVERY FACILITY
APRIL 2017 OPERATION REPORT

The waste water treatment plan has not experienced any excursions from the NYSPDES permit parameters.

Average flows are unusually low, probably do to the extremely poor weather .

The plant has been receiving an influx of an acid from illegal dumping into the sewer district. Additional chemicals have been purchase to offset the toxin . The chemicals required are expensive as well as the extra time required to monitor and correct the issues. The generator of the toxin has not been identified, but testing thru-out the system will continue until the source is identified. DEC is aware and will assist if necessary with enforcement.

The gear drive on the tertiary drum filter failed. John McGowen of Koester associates was able to assist in a rebuild of the unit instead of replacement.

There has been a request to connect to the sewer system by Henry Heath.

Brad Fox continues to train at the plant .
