Inlet Parks Dept Report for June 2017  
Mitch Lee Parks Dept. Supervisor

1. Events all seem to be going very well with the support of Parks Staff, .....(Black Fly Challenge, Concerts and Fourth of July). The preparations and tear down of these events requires time that has taken us away from our Siding of the Changing room facilities. Couple this with The loss of the Pump under cottage one for the Arrowhead Restrooms, the severity of the wet Spring weather and the time that the Waste water treatment facility takes from one staffer on weekends and as of late with the Plant needing extra special visits, and we are still a bit behind.
2. I would like to thank the Highway Dept. for the use of the Skid Steer to prep the beach for use. and For the rehab of Drainage around the Rest Room Building.
3. All paver's on hand have been laid out on the Lake front pathway.
4. With the Wet weather at Arrowhead park we were able to reseed many of our blank and refurbished ground in house.
5. The amount of trash and recycle materials we hauled and sorted in the last two weeks of June were much greater than we have seen at the start of the summer season. To Recycle the park requires hours of sorting and cleaning that some of the Town Hall staff do not understand.
6. We hope with only 9 days between the clean up of the Fourth of July and the Arts In the Park that we will have time to complete the siding on the Changing facility.
7. Our Town Hall cleaner has returned to duty for only two hours a day five days a week while he recuperates his foot.
8. "Over-Time" has been offered to the Parks Staff till July 16th at 6 hours per week but with the conditions of their personal schedules they have used it very little. But the hours they did use were put to good use.
9. All water tests for our Beach, Cottages, Arrowhead Park, Fern Park, and Town Hall have been good samples. The next Pick up by Verona LABS is Noon on July 18th.
10. We would like to thank the Town Clerk for all her efforts to plant water the flowers.

## Information Office Report

of the month June 2017

1. The Inlet Lamp Lighter is still on hold.
2. Balance in Petty Cash on June 30 was \$53.70.
3. From April 1, 2017 to June 30, 2017 this office has processed 0 snowmobile permits for the 2017/18 season. During March, this office sold 18 permits for the 2017/18 season at the preseason rate of \$65. The Information Office will continue to sell 2017/18 Snowmobile Permits for the preseason rate of \$65 each until November 15, 2017. Permits can also be purchased at the Town of Webb Visitor Center and online at OldForgeNY.com. Stickers will be printed some time in September and will be then be mailed to anyone who has purchased one prior to printing.
4. During the 2016 "Arts in the Park," \$3,080 was collected from 36 vendors to reserve 38 ½ spaces in the 2017 show. During December, \$730 was collected from 12 vendors to reserve 12 spaces in the 2017 Fall Festival. Since January 1<sup>st</sup>, we have collected an additional \$1710 from 22 vendors to reserve 22 spaces for "Arts in the Park" and \$1020 from 15 vendors to reserve 19 spaces at Fall Festival. Since January we have had 2 Fall Festival and 4 "Arts in the Park" vendors cancel. 5 have asked for refunds (50%) and one transferred his refund towards Fall Festival. 5. The IABA is currently collecting dues for 2017. You do not have to own a business to become a member of IABA, and you do not have to be a member to participate. Membership dues are only \$50/year. Membership Chair is Danicia Nerschook of Sunset Beach Cottages and she will also be happy to help. 9. Black Fly Challenge went very well. 894 registered with 812 finishers. The committee has taken notes to make next year's even better.

We have absolutely fallen in love with the beautiful town of Inlet. My husband and I are from Syracuse, NY and we are at the age, with our children grown, that we have the time to explore the Adirondacks. We want to set summer roots and feel Inlet and surroundings is the place.

But what we experienced our first day here has caused us much stress. As I drove south on Rte 28 through the heart of town, a woman in the <sup>first</sup> crosswalk (hardware & stepped out in front of our car and I nearly hit her. She yelled at me and I felt shocked as she had come from nowhere. Then later that day the exact same thing happened heading south at the second crosswalk (Furniture Store), even though I was now more aware!

My life would be over if I had maimed or caused a brain injury to someone as I am a school nurse for the Syracuse City Schools. I have a fierce appreciation for health and the prevention of disease and accidents.

Here are our suggestions to prevent an accident:

1. Reduce speed limit through the town to 15 mph.

1. Repaint the crosswalk lines to make them even more visible.

2. Change the signs to "Stop For Pedistrians in the Crosswalk

3. Put the signs on both sides of the road.

4. Establish two No Parking areas, 15 feet in length, before the two crosswalks heading south.  
(There is a 15 foot No Parking area in front of both crosswalks heading north.)

(Also, we spoke to John Greco. He is very much in favor of a No Parking area that would be in front <sup>in front of his store</sup> of his store. (He wants the <sup>other</sup> No Parking lines <sup>^</sup> moved to the other side of the telephone pole, by the way. He said he will contact you about this.)

We spoke to Becky, manager of the Hardware store, and she is personally in favor of the idea, but she pointed out that she is not the owner.)

5. Put "Crosswalk Ahead, Prepare to Stop for Pedistrians" signs 20 feet before each crosswalk on both sides.
