We would like to thank Levi Lumber for the use of their sky lift bucket for the decoration of the massive Town Christmas tree, which took 1200 lights to decorate.

The refurbishment of the boards and floor at Fern Park are complete and now just await colder temperatures to make ice. We hope that without having to install the matt we can get extended use of the facility by the School children for Gym Classes.

Painting on the finished exterior of the Restroom building in Arrowhead Park started but was suspended as colder weather came. It will resume in the spring.

We would like to thank the Highway Department for helping us reshape the upper Landing at Fern Parks Sledding Hill.

Trail work has started at Fern Park with Brushing and widening of trails. They were GPS ed on 11/1/17 By Michael Bartolotti so that we may make a new map and signage for 2018.

The Parks Department helped to hang the Snow fence through out the Township that helps to define private property from Snowmobile trail.

The Christmas decorations were hung on the telephone poles and through the park for the upcoming Christmas on Main Street Programs.

Cottages and Bath House were shut down and winterized.

Docks and the Work Barge were put away for the winter season.

Picnic tables and Trash receptacles were put up for the season and 40 benches went into the shop for repair and staining.

I attended the recent Fern Park Master Plan Meeting and Provided that committee with the 2004 Fern Park Master Plan and an Updated list of Facility amenities and the last ten years of updates done at Fern Park.

Information Office Report

of the month October 2017

1. The Inlet Lamp Lighter is still on hold.
2. Balance in Petty Cash on October 31 was \$48.45.
3. From April 1, 2017 to October 31, 2017 this office has taken money for 112 snowmobile permits for the 2017/18 season (111 Preseason, 1 Deal). During March, this office sold 18 permits for the 2017/18 season at the preseason rate of \$65. The Information Office will continue to sell 2017/18 Snowmobile Permits for the preseason rate of \$65 each until November 15, 2017. Permits can also be purchased at the Town of Webb Visitor Center and online at OldForgeNY.com. The Webb/Inlet Snowmobile Trails officially open, weather permitting, on December 4th.
4. During the 2016 "Arts in the Park," \$3,160 was collected from 37 vendors to reserve 39 ½ spaces in the 2017 show. During December, \$730 was collected from 12 vendors to reserve 12 spaces in the 2017 Fall Festival. After January 1st, we collected an additional \$1,790 from 23 vendors to reserve 23 spaces for "Arts in the Park" and \$2,230 from 37 vendors to reserve 42 spaces at Fall Festival. We had 6 Fall Festival and 6 "Arts in the Park" vendors cancel. 5 asked for (50%) refunds.
5. During the 2017 "Arts in the Park," \$2,480 was collected from 29 vendors to reserve 30 spaces (two also paid for additional space) for the 2018 "Arts in the Park". During the 2017 Fall Festival and up until September 30, \$1,280 was collected from 20 vendors to reserve 23 spaces for the 2018 Fall Festival.
6. Keep checking www.InletNY.com, and send us all comments, suggestions, etc. We will also continue accepting photos, especially pictures with people in them enjoying Inlet! You can send pictures to info@inletny.com. And if you have any interest in blogging about Inlet, we need bloggers!
7. Still waiting to hear back from Deputy Hutchins about scheduling another pistol permit class in Inlet soon.
8. The IABA will hold a regular meeting on November 7th at The Toboggan Inn and a regular meeting on December 5th at Screamen Eagle. The night of the Holiday Open House, which includes home-based businesses set up at Screamen Eagle, is scheduled for December 19th. 9. Adirondack Kids Day was great day, even with the rain. Over 200 children attended with their families, for an estimate of over 500 people hanging around Inlet on October 7th. 70 children signed up for the French Louie Fishing Derby and together they caught 142 fish. This is a great event full of free activities for children of all ages. I hope the town continues to support this event.
10. Cycle Adirondacks will announce the route for their 2018 tour on November 14th at the Tannery Pond Community Center in North Creek. Inlet is going to be on that route and the 200 cyclists will be staying 2 nights in Inlet in August. During their visit they will camp at Fern Park and have an off site Looking forward to working with them on this. www.CycleAdirondacks.com
11. Currently working on Adirondack Christmas on Main Street – November 24-26, 2017. Businesses are encouraged to be open for this weekend, decorate for the holiday and have an activity or offer a special. All businesses, even ones that are not open, are encouraged to donate something to the Basket Raffle. Details about the event can be found on www.InletChristmasonMainStreet.com and will be shared on Inlet's Facebook page. Inlet's schedule is also listed on the CAA's page www.ADKChristmasonMain.com

13. Letters will be sent out in November asking businesses to support the free Champagne Bus on New Year's Eve.
14. The Inlet Barnstormers will not be holding a snowmobile safety course on December 9th, but will have one on January 13th at the Inlet Volunteer Emergency Services Building.
15. We will soon be looking for the 2018 Frozen King & Queen. Nominations are welcome.
16. The 2018 summer concerts are almost all set. I am just wanting for confirmation from a couple bands. The grant application has been submitted. You can find the lineup at www.InletConcertSeries.com.
