Inlet Parks Department Report for July 2018 Mitch Lee Parks Supervisor

Our Contract for rent to own has ended and we are now paying a straight Lift rental fee unless we pay the balance and own it. The Parks Dept. will have it in use every day during September as that is when we are Re-Roofing number 2 Cottage. It has been in use as much as is possible painting the Youth Building, installing the Fern Water line, Placing wifi heads in the Parks, and a host of other small tasks since we have had it on site. This tool is invaluable. At this point if we pay the Rental and do not purchase it this month it will cost us \$1,600.00 more later.

Frank Able has been out of work since July 23rd with a medical issue we wish him a speedy recovery. We also wish to thank the Highway Dept. for the loan of a man during the build up and tear down of Symphony, Navy Band, and Shakespeare in the park, Army Band Lake front Concert and Car show weekend.

A good deal of work has been done on the floor to fern park to make it ready for the water proof paint cover and we hope to put the seal coat on it by mid August.

A large number of boards were replaced on the floating and ridged boardwalk

The Youth Commission Building has started its facelift with new paint.

Tyco- has installed 16 new heads in Town Hall for our Fire alarm system and we hope this will cure the failures we saw during May and June with the many alarms reported out to 911.

The water fountain is now up and running at Fern Park with a good reading from the Dept of Health. They have also given us two months to replace our Wellheads to new sanitary wellheads.

All our water tests through July were in good order.

Evaluations for all Parks Staff will start mid August.

The Park Staff is very happy to have survived such a busy end of July 2018 and the staff should be congratulated for the "Disney Like" conditions of our grounds and rest rooms.

Information Office Report

of the month July 2018

1. Balance in Petty Cash on July 31 was \$70.54.
2. From April 1, 2018 to July 31, 2018 this office has processed 0 snowmobile permits for the 2018/19 season. The Information Office will continue to sell 2018/19 Snowmobile Permits for the preseason rate of \$65 each until November 15, 2018. Permits can also be purchased at the Town of Webb Visitor Center and online at OldForgeNY.com. Stickers will be printed some time in September and will be then be mailed to anyone who has purchased one prior to printing. (During March, this office sold 75 permits for the 2018/19 season at the preseason rate of \$65. Old Forge sold 730.)
3. During the 2017 "Arts in the Park," \$2,480 was collected from 29 vendors to reserve 30 spaces (two also paid for additional space) for the 2018 "Arts in the Park". During the 2017 Fall Festival and up until September 30, \$1,280 was collected from 20 vendors to reserve 23 spaces for the 2018 Fall Festival. Since January 1st, we have collected an additional \$2,670 from 32 vendors to reserve 33 spaces for "Arts in the Park" (two are for one-day only) and \$890 from 15 vendors to

reserve 15 spaces in Fall Festival. Applications for Fall Festival are still being accepted. The applications and a list of vendors already signed up can be found at www.inletfallfestival.com.

RESOLVED, the Town Board of the Town of Inlet hereby requests and authorizes the Superintendent of Highways to request a speed study for this portion of the Town of Inlet Road by NYS DOT.
