Inlet Parks Department Report For November 2017

1. Fern Park has seen some new bridges, built both by Parks Staff and DEC on their property. Trail work on all lower loops is ready for snow and grooming.
2. The Ice rink will be open when the water is fully frozen and with the temps as of late it should not be long.
3. The Parks Dept. has a list of changes for Arrowhead Park from our insurance company to complete for the Spring of 2018. Pirate ship reconfiguration, Red W Aluminum playground equipment to be shortened height wise and better fall zone. Plastic covers for the Outfield fencing rehabilitated.
4. Our Cleaning staffer is back to work and we are very grateful.
5. The staff has done a great job decorating Town Hall and the Downtown for the Winter season.
6. Grooming on the Ski Trails and at the golf course should resume soon.

The Inlet Parks Dept. had received a Quote for a SNow-master 48 For \$3,296.62 For grooming the ski trails. This will replace a 28 year old Drag that has seen a full overhaul far to many times. It also will be just like the current grooming Drag we already have making parts interchangeable. For Competitive bid quotes we have ,

of the month November 2017

1. The Inlet Lamp Lighter is still on hold.
2. Balance in Petty Cash on November 30 was \$57.95.
3. From April 1, 2017 to November 30, 2017 this office has processed 339 snowmobile permits for the 2017/18 season (328 Preseason, 6 Deal, 5 Seasonal). Old Forge processed 7,643 (7,408 Preseason, 25 Deal, 199 Seasonal, 11 Replacement). These numbers are up from last year's 312 (310 P, 1 D, 1 S) & 6,569 (6,359 P, 19 D, 178 S, 1 R, 12?). The Webb/Inlet Snowmobile Trails officially open on December 4<sup>th</sup>, weather permitting.
4. During the 2017 "Arts in the Park," \$2,480 was collected from 29 vendors to reserve 30 spaces (two also paid for additional space) for the 2018 "Arts in the Park". During the 2017 Fall Festival and up until September 30, \$1,280 was collected from 20 vendors to reserve 23 spaces for the 2018 Fall Festival. **INLET WATER RESOURCE RECOVERY FACILITY****NOVEMBER 2017 OPERATION REPORT**

The waste water treatment plant has not experienced any excursions from the NYSPDES permit parameters.

Two pumps that failed previously have been pulled for service. One being the filter feed pump, the other is an equalization grinder pump.

The plant has experienced power grid interruption followed by a generator fault at 2:30 am, caused the plant to go off line. System was restored by 10:30 am. A computer component failure had occurred, and the component has been replaced.

The pump station dialer which was required to be installed on PS for the newly constructed residence has not been completed and is not operational. This was over 6 months ago. I would like to proceed with an issuance of a notice of incompleteness and violation.

Brad Fox continues to train at the plant.

As a reminder, businesses that have grease traps must have them pumped on a regular basis. Grease is entering the treatment stream.
