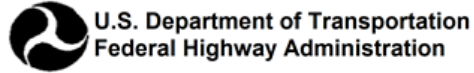

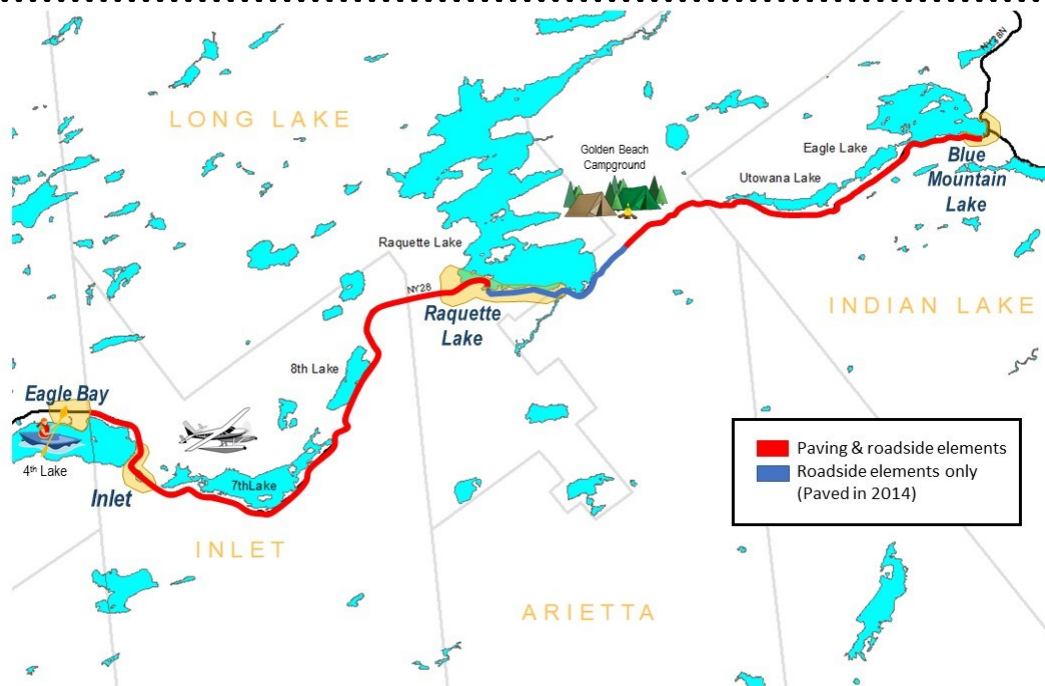

PURPOSE OF MEETING

PROJECT LOCATION

The project is located on NYS Route 28 from the Hamilton County line in Eagle Bay, and proceeds north for 25 miles ending at the Durant Road Intersection in Blue Mt. Lake.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this project are:

1. Restore pavement surfaces to good condition and maintain overall structural integrity of the highway.
2. Address roadside safety elements along corridor such as guiderail replacement, drainage and signs.

PROPOSED ALTERNATIVES

This Pavement Rehabilitation project covers a 25.4 mile stretch of Rte. 28 starting at the Hamilton County Line and ending in Blue Mountain Lake. Roadside elements to be addressed in this project include guiderail, drainage, signs, driveway work, intersection work, and snowmobile crossings.

The project will consist of two pavement treatments. The first treatment will involve milling off the existing pavement surface and placing a new asphalt overlay from the County Line through the Hamlet of Inlet and also through the hamlet of Raquette Lake. The second will involve Cold In-Place Recycling of the top 4" of the existing pavement and adding a new 2 course asphalt overlay.

PROJECT SCHEDULE

The Department anticipates completing project design in 2018 with construction beginning in Spring 2019 and completing by Summer 2020.
