Regular Meeting February 11, 2020 Inlet Town Board

The Regular Meeting was called to order by Supervisor Frey, at 7:30 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Present were: Highway Superintendent Shawn Hansen, Assessor/Codes Aimee VanWie, Peter Funk, Dave Scranton, Becky Townsend and Don Townsend.

Officials present were: Supervisor Frey, Councilman Levi, Councilman Townsend, Councilman Schmid, Councilman Brownsell and Town Clerk Yvonne Lutz.

MINUTES REVIEW – Supervisor Frey asked if there were any additions or corrections to the January regular meeting minutes. Supervisor Frey just wanted to clarify that he was reaching out to Chazen and C&S regarding the communications tower.

PUBLIC COMMENT –

JOHN TOWNSEND PROPERTY - Townsend family would like to obtain ownership of a strip of land that separates the John Townsend property into two lots. A value would have to be determined and research as to how it could be done is needed. Would also have to have a public hearing, including a permissive referendum. Yvonne Lutz spoke that she believes that strip is where the deeded lake rights to Seventh Lake for her house are. More research from John Deming will be done.

Councilman Brownsell made a **MOTION** to start the process with a public hearing opening at 7:45 pm on March 10. Councilman Levi **SECONDED**.

4 AYES 0 NAYS MOTION CARRIED Councilman Townsend recused himself

PARKS EMPLOYEE –

Brad Fox spoke regarding his position with the Town of Inlet and his love for the job. He read a statement to the Board expressing his wishes to keep his job and why things had happened to cause his termination. Brad expressed that he feels it was a lack of communication and dislike from co-workers that caused any issues. He reminded everyone of how hard he works. Mitch Lee defended the accusations that other employees were not easy to get along with and as hard of workers, as Brad had indicated. Dave Scranton spoke and said he felt that Brad was a huge asset to the town and that he is somewhat mistreated. Supervisor Frey clarified that a portion of Brad Fox's pay included a stipend for helping with coverage of the WWTP. Councilman Brownsell added that others were given this opportunity and did not want the job at the WWTP. Dave Scranton added that he doesn't see an issue with an employee being a few minutes late.

COMMUNICATIONS - There will be a communications meeting 2/12 and many will be in attendance. Would like to get a set timeline for the APA permit for tower on Funk's Hill. Supervisor Frey added there is a number to call to get a refund from Spectrum for the outage that happened recently. There was rumor that the groomer, which had hit a pole outside of Inlet was responsible for the Frontier outage, however, that was not the case.

CAP21 – Cap21 is still working on helping different towns secure highspeed internet. Working to have all underserved areas addressed.

PARKS DEPARTMENT – Park's Supervisor, Mitch Lee provides a report each month that is available online and attached to the agenda packet.

ASSESSOR/CODES - Assessor and Codes/Zoning Officer, Aimee VanWie provides a report each month and is available online and attached to the agenda packet

INFORMATION OFFICE – Publicity Director, Adele Burnett provides a detailed monthly report online and is attached to agenda packet. In addition to past events and information about her department, this report will detail upcoming events.

HIGHWAY

Superintendent Hansen reported on the numerous projects that they have been working on, in addition to plowing, sanding, installing springs on truck and Mack going out for repairs. The 284 report was discussed and what projects would be encompassed. Supervisor Frey had thanked the Highway Department for all the hard work with the recent storm.

TRANSFER STATION –

Transfer Station is closed Tuesday, Wednesday and Fridays. The hours seem to be going well so far. Keeping up on the sorting. Received two quotes for a new 30 yard container. Fairly close in price, however, specifications on each was discussed. The Board didn't see a real difference in the two. Councilman Levi made a **MOTION** to purchase the less expensive one with WasteQuip at \$5595. Councilman Townsend **SECONDED**.

Town of Inlet February 11, 2020

Supervisor Frey spoke regarding his frustration on the retirement system and reporting. Regarding the lack of service hours credited, specifically to the justices after retirement.

NATIONAL GRID – Town Clerk presented a letter from National Grid and an easement needed to move a pole from a neighboring property to partially on the Town property in the ballpark area (road). The Board reviewed the proposed location on a map, however, did not feel comfortable signing the easement until the physically went out to the location to determine the new placement.

SUPERVISOR –

AUDIT – Board had reviewed the Supervisor's reports for the years and all the funds balances/deficits presented by Yvonne Lutz. Some fund lines were overspent, however, were to be funded by other lines that had funds unspent. Councilman Brownsell made a

Dave Scranton asked if the golf course has been open yet and at this time, it has not because they need at least 18 inches of snow to groom. Mr. Corasanti was thanked for the use of his equipment and help on the trails. His equipment worked even better with the conditions currently. Dave Scranton asked what discussions have been had with Mr. Corasanti regarding the easements to start working on the land for the mountain bike trails. He added that we are lucky to have someone like Dave Corasanti to work with. Supervisor Frey agreed that he is wonderful to work with.

PUBLIC COMMENT – Aimee VanWie wanted to state for the record that Frank Abel is a dedicated worker and always looks out for the town employees. She added that he drives a long distance to be here and is always reliable.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

A copy of the monthly report for permit activity is on file in the Town Clerk's office.

I attended The Northern Adirondack Code Enforcement Conference. New Codes will be started May 12, 2020 instead of books they will be released in a PDF form and with a subscription to ACCES for internet access. There have been some changes and updates throughout the Codes but the biggest change is NYS will no longer have a supplement for State specific Codes; the PDF will include all NYS changes.

ASSESSOR

I attended a Hamilton County Assessors meeting February 21st; John Stack attended from ORPTS and gave us all the latest updates from the State. There was discussion about the information the State uses for Towns LOL and Ratios. We currently are with Old Forge for sales and market information which has an influence; other Towns in the county are in Hamilton County markets. We remain at 100% for this year; however a Town Wide Revalue should be planned for within the next 5 years.

I am required to take the course Ethics and the Assessor within one year of my reappointment the course is being offered Friday March 13th in Vernon Downs, I have registered to attend.

1. With better snow coverage we were able to groom for about one month at the Inlet Golf Club.
2. Our temporary hire of a part time staffer Gordy Rudd has worked out very well and we will probably use him during late March early April until a new Full Time Staffer can be found.
3. The Parks Staff did a very great job prepping the Locations at Fern Park and Arrowhead Park for the Annual Fire & Lights Event.
4. As temperatures rise and grooming gets suspended we will turn to Park Clean up and Out door Furniture repair.
5. We still have two Community Service Staffers who are helping in the Parks Dept. Both individuals should fulfill hour by April 30th.
6. We would like to thank the Highway Dept for the great snow removal they did in advance of Frozen Fire & Lights.

1. Balance in **Petty Cash** on February 29 was \$29.39.
2. From April 1, 2019 to February 29, 2020 this office processed 937 **snowmobile permits** for the 2019/20 season: 367 Preseason19, 221 Seasonal, 89 Seasonal19, 25 Seasonal Weekday, 7 Seasonal Weekday19, 198 Weekly, 10 Upgrades & 20 Replacement permits. 57 of the Preseason were paid for in March 2019. Old Forge processed 16,018: 29 Preseason, 10,261 Preseason19, 1,754 Seasonal, 1,334 Seasonal19, 179 Seasonal Weekday, 36 Seasonal Weekday19, 2,052 Weekly, 25 Weekly19, 140 Upgrade, 8 Upgrade19 & 200 Replacement. Old Forge Camping Resort processed 23: 8 Seasonal, 6 Seasonal19 & 9 Weekly. Water's Edge processed 62: 26 Seasonal, 8 Seasonal19, 20 Weekly & 2 Weekly19. Stillwater processed 52: 22 Seasonal, 5 Seasonal19, 6 Seasonal Weekday, 20 Weekly, 2 Weekly19. Total processed this year 17,092. Last year's numbers: Inlet 1,093 (418 Preseason, 405 Seasonal, 28 Weekday, 203 Weekly, 13 Upgrade, 26 Replacement), Old Forge 15,113 (8,688 Preseason, 3,839 Seasonal, 161 Weekday, 2,044 Weekly, 153 Upgrade, 288 Replacement), Old Forge Camping Resort 58 (31 Seasonal, 27 Weekly), Stillwater Hotel 65 (26 Seasonal, 4 Weekday, 35 Weekly), Water's Edge 149 (75 Seasonal, 16 Weekday, 58 Weekly). **Total of 886 more processed this year.** Snofest Deal starts March 6th. This is when one can purchase next year's permit at pre-season rate and also get a sticker to ride out the rest of this season. **I am still hoping Inlet might be able to offer an online shopping cart for snowmobile permits.**
3. During February 2020, \$0 was collected from 0 businesses for a **co-op ad** in the CAA's 2020 vacation planner; and was given to the clerk to be deposited into the Publicity account 6410.400.
4. During February 2020, \$0 was collected towards the **summer concert series**; and was given to the clerk to be deposited into the Publicity account 6410.412.
5. Applications for the **2020 "Arts in the Park" and Inlet Fall Festival** were made available on January 1st. An email will be sent letting vendors know this and paper applications (83 of them) will be mailed to those who requested. Applications and information can be found at www.inletartsinthepark.com and www.inletfallfestival.com. During February 2020, \$360 was collected from 4 vendors to reserve 4 spaces at "Arts in the Park," and \$130 was collected from 3 vendors to reserve 2 spaces at Fall Festival (\$5 was a late payment from 1 vendor.) On February 29, there were 22 spaces available for "Arts in the Park" and 28 spaces available for Fall Festival including 8 indoor and 2 food. A total of \$490 was deposited into the Concessions Account 2024.000.
6. **The IABA's next regular meeting will be March 3rd** and will be at The Tavern. The April 7th meeting will be at Fourth Lake Wine & Spirits and the May Spring Social will be at Duffy's @ The Glenmore - details TBD. This group has lots of great ideas and continues to work well together. Notes from IABA meetings can be found at www.GoInletNY.com. **You can also pay your dues online!**
7. **Fern Park Master Plan Committee** will continue to meet each month at 7:00 p.m. in the meeting room of Inlet Town Hall. Their next meeting will be held on Tuesday, March 24th at 7:00 p.m. Anyone interested in the future of Fern Park is welcome to attend. They hope to have a draft document ready soon, which they will share during a public meeting, yet to be scheduled. Notes and updates from this meeting can be found at www.townofinlet.org, click on Projects.
8. As a result of the **Climate Smart Communities** meeting in the Old Forge, a Task Force is being formed that will work on identifying projects and needs in our community. We are hoping the Town Board will appoint Aimee VanWie chair of this task force which will include elected officials, department heads, maintenance staff, teachers, and interested citizens.
9. **Frozen Fire & Lights** full report will be available upon request, and a thank you will be sent to the papers as well as posted on www.frozenfireandlights.com.

10. March 13 is **Old Forge's St. Patty's Day Parade**. I am hoping Inlet will be represented during this event. The Frozen Royals are working on a float this year and welcome anyone to join them. Float decorating will take place at 6:00 p.m. on both 3/11 & 3/12 at Henry Heath's barn. Parade starts at 5:00 p.m.
11. **The Shirt Design contest for this year's Community Pride Day** is still happening. The top designs will remain online for voting by the public until March 15 and the winner will be announced the next day. If anyone wishes to sponsor the event to help pay for the shirts or help provide lunch for the volunteers, forms are available now with a **deadline of March 20th** to be listed on the shirt. I plan to have the design finalized and shirts ordered by April 1st. Sponsorship forms and information about the event can be found at www.inletny.com/inlet/community-pride-day.
12. Mitch will have a booth representing Inlet and Black Fly Challenge at the **Adirondack Sports Summer Expo** in Saratoga Springs on March 21 & 22.
13. I am collecting prizes for the 5th annual **Adult Egg Hunt** which will be held on April 25. Prizes can come from anyone and can be just about anything. Examples from last year include candy, gift certificates, bottles of all sizes of alcohol, drink chips, t-shirts, movie passes, candles, jewelry, etc. Items can be dropped off at my office, or if you would like someone to pick them up just give us a call.
14. Registration for the **25th running of the Black Fly Challenge** opened on December 18. As of February 29th, there were 239 registered. The race will be held on Saturday, June 13 and will start a half hour earlier leaving Arrowhead Park at 10:00 a.m. The committee has been meeting regularly and we are looking forward to an awesome event. Information about sponsoring this event can be found at www.blackflychallenge.com.
15. Layla Carswell from Skeeter and Company has been doing a great job helping the Town of Inlet gain a better, more effective, **social media presence**. She will continue to help me promote the business and all the activities/events Inlet has to offer. She will also be working with Black Fly Challenge soon.
16. I would like to see **webcams installed at Fern Park**. One that looks at the ice skating rink and another that looks towards the sledding hill and trailhead. I would like to be able to share the webcams on InletSnow.com so people can check them for conditions. Ideally, in view of the rink cam could be an OPEN/CLOSED sign so people would know when it might be closed due to bad ice conditions.
17. I do not have any updates to report on the **sign for the front of the town hall** building that says "Inlet Town Hall" and "Information Office."
18. I have only heard back from 3 of the 12 **unrepairable benches** so far. Two would like to take their plaques and one is looking into getting a new bench for theirs.
19. In addition to the calendar that hangs outside my office, there is a **google calendar** that shows when the meeting room and the senior room are being used. This makes it easy for those who have access to schedule meetings from anywhere without conflict. There is also a Vacations/Out of the Office calendar where it can be posted when employees will be out of on vacation. All inletny.com emails can access these calendars. If you need the link, let me know.
20. I will be out of the office starting April 4 and will not be back in until April 21. As always, I can be reached by email or text if needed.

RESOLUTION NO.**REQUESTING AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT TO POST WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS ON TOWN ROADS FOR THE YEAR 2020****DATED:****BY**

WHEREAS, Vehicle and Traffic Law Article 41, Section 1660 gives authority to the Town Board to post weight limits on Town Roads when the Board deems necessary to protect roads from harm during spring break up, and

WHEREAS, Vehicle and Traffic Law Article 40, Section 1650 gives authority to the county superintendent of highways to post weight limits on County Roads when the superintendent deems it necessary to protect County roads from harm during spring break up, and

WHEREAS, the Town would need to place an ad in the local newspaper notifying the public of such postings, and

WHEREAS, the County Superintendent places a legal ad in the local newspaper notifying the public of such posting on County highways, and

WHEREAS, the Town roads are typically posted for the same duration as the County roads, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board and Town Highway Superintendent believes that it would be in the interest of the Town if the County Superintendent post weight restrictions on the Town roads in conjunction with the County Roads during spring break up, be it

RESOLVED, the Town Board of the Town of Inlet hereby requests and authorizes the County Superintendent of Highways post weight restrictions on Town roads within the Town of Inlet when he deems necessary for the calendar year 2020.
