## Regular Meeting February 8, 2022 Inlet Town Board

An executive session was held at 7:15 pm to discuss a police department matter.  
The Regular Meeting was called to order by Supervisor Frey, at 7:30 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Present were: Chief Ron Johnston, Highway Superintendent Shawn Hansen, Toby Linfield, Robin Hill, Codes/Assessor Aimee VanWie, Parks Supervisor, Mike Bartolotti, and Connie Perry.

Official's present were Supervisor Frey, Councilman Levi, Councilman Townsend, Councilman Schmid via Zoom, Councilman Brownsell and Town Clerk Yvonne Lutz.

**MINUTES REVIEW** – Supervisor Frey asked if there were any additions or corrections to the January meeting minutes. The mileage rate for 2022 should read 58.5 cents per mile.

### **PUBLIC COMMENT –**

**MOMENT OF SILENCE** – Supervisor Frey asked for a moment of silence for Mary Yahnke who always

had a welcoming smile on her face and will be missed.

**COVID** – Supervisor Frey stated that there are no real updates and is hopeful that the mask mandates will be relaxing. Frey added that you can still get Covid with the vaccination, however, it will keep you out of the hospital. Vaccination is still the key.

**CLIMATE SMART** – Supervisor Frey apologized to Connie for not getting her the letter she needed supporting the energy saving options that were presented in a meeting with Living ADK, Country Suburban, and Climate Smart. Information was given on the different ways to save money and become a greener community. You can have you home evaluated to see where you can save on energy. Aimee VanWie gave a handout that indicated the Town, and the residents can be eligible for different grants to help with the costs. There was discussion on options of going geothermal and the tax brakes for purchasing more green options for heating/cooling.

**REPLACE LIGHTS AT FERN PARK** - Aimee VanWie gave the presentation for replacing lights at Fern Park and the money it would save in the future. There was also discussion on the charging stations and that proposals are forthcoming. Councilman Townsend made a **MOTION** to support the light upgrade at Fern Park. Councilman Schmid **SECONDED**.

### **5 AYES 0 NAYS MOTION CARRIED**

**LIVING ADK** - Robin Hill spoke that Living Adk, formerly CAP21, is looking to support a bus route

from Lewis County/Port Leyden to this area to encourage more employees to come work in the area.

### **COMMUNICATIONS –**

Verizon tower, behind the St. Anthony's church is functional. There is a glitch, however, that the 911 calls placed on a cell phone in town are routed to Albany. It is being worked on, however, if you need to place a 911 call from your cell phone, please tell them it should be Herkimer 911. The tower to be placed on Corasanti property is moving forward, however, the APA has asked more questions and they are waiting on other agencies of the State to complete GIS data.

**PARKS DEPARTMENT** – Park's Supervisor, Mike Bartolotti thanked Shawn Hansen and his department for all their help, thanked Chip Sauer for helping to groom the golf course, Dave Corasanti for helping to groom Fern Park, John Townsend for the wire, and Brian Schoen for all his help with the ice rink.

**RECREATIONAL GRANT** - Mike stated that he is talking to Dan Kieferbach about recreational grants. They are meeting and have ideas at Fern Park. New signage and ski tracks are just a couple of ideas. He is looking at a \$4,200 grant, however, it is matching, and he will need a letter of support from the Board. Mike expressed his wish to look into tracks for the John Deere. The snowmobiles get stuck often and are very unsteady. He has Cazenovia putting together a proposal.

**TOWN HALL BATHROOMS** - Mike stated that a near future project is to remodel the bathrooms in the Town Hall. They need updating and are way overdue.

**ASSESSOR/CODES** - Assessor and Codes/Zoning Officer, Aimee VanWie provides a report each month and is available online and attached to the agenda packet. Aimee mentioned that the Town will have to look at spending money for a town wide re-val. She needs to advertise for a data collection person, hopefully someone that could possibly grow into Aimee’s job.

**INFORMATION OFFICE** – Publicity Director, Adele Burnett provides a detailed monthly report online and is attached to agenda packet. In addition to past events and information about her department, this report will detail upcoming events.

**HIGHWAY**

The Board discussed and signed the 284 Form for highway.  
Superintendent Hansen reported on the numerous projects that they have been working on. In addition:

- Plowed snow.
- Cleared sidewalks and parking lots
- Hauled garbage and recyclables
- Had a new heat run installed in my office. It’s a lot

better temperature wise.  
Moved snow from around town on to the

snowmobile trail between Inlet and Eagle Bay to get the trail away from the road.

Took our 2018 Mack to Utica Mack for a regen issue. I would like to thank Tracy Eldridge and Chris Mitchell from Hamilton County Highway for setting up a spare truck if we ended up leaving ours in Utica. It’s nice to know that help isn’t too far away.

Our new plow caught the bridge joint in Raquette Lake and did some pretty good damage to the funnel and frame. Had an insurance adjuster come up and look at it. We are awaiting our salesman from Viking to come up and prepare a list to make plow as good as new.

Would like to thank Stephen Cole for helping us out last Thursday as we were shorthanded.

Coming Up

- Plow snow
- Clear sidewalks and parking lots
- Haul garbage and recyclables
- Move snow from spots it gets piled up in town. Move snow to trails when time allows
- I would just like to say that we have been hearing

some people are not happy with the way the roads are being plowed. Meaning they feel that we are not leaving snow for the snowmobiles. I would like to say that they are just that ROADS. In my opinion we are very gracious with the way we plow our



roads trying to keep a happy medium. We cannot be leaving roads unplowed. If the Fire, EMS or the traveling public cannot get across these roads then we are not doing our jobs. This issue comes up every year. Uncas Rd is always one that comes up. I cannot control the fact that the sun burns the snow off of that road. We do not use salt on our town and county roads unless it is freezing rain. We put shelves on the scraper banks on the sides of our roads. The Barnstormers are supposed to be grooming the side of the Uncas Rd to get the snowmobile traffic out of the road.

We have some new lights for the ends of the building. They are the same as the one we have at our shop. LED with dusk to dawn eyes.

**POLICE** – Chief Johnston spoke about needing a new police vehicle. The vehicle we have now is a 2016 and even though we are not scheduled to replace this vehicle until next year, with Covid and lack of vehicles, parts, etc., vehicles are extremely difficult to get. He had a vehicle ordered in TOW for 3 months and the order was just cancelled. He does not want that to happen to us. Chief Johnston spoke to a GM rep and vehicles are usually taking about 5-8 months; however, he can get one March 5<sup>th</sup> because two dealers that buy extra vehicles has one. The PA dealer had a better price. The new vehicle is about \$43,000 and the upfitting is about \$16,000. JPJ is having trouble getting chips for light bars, etc., however, are working on it. He is worried that if we don't get a vehicle now, we may have to wait 2 years and he feels the 2016 vehicle may not last that long. Chief stated that he is not spending his snowmobile law enforcement grant on snowmobile patrol, because of the lack of snow. These funds would help support the new vehicle. Supervisor Frey stated that there is the money saved each year in the budget also.

Councilman Schmid made a **MOTION** to purchase the new police vehicle and Councilman Levi **SECONDED**.

Robin Hill spoke regarding MVHS and NYS Health Foundation are working with OF Ambulance for a pilot program on mobile integrated health. This would save residents on health insurance, and she will keep us posted.

1. Balance in **Petty Cash** on February 28 was \$27.67.
2. From April 1, 2021 to February 28, 2022 this office processed 851 **snowmobile permits** for the 2020/21 season (347 Preseason (58 sold in March 2020,) 348 Seasonal, 23 Weekday, 119 Weekly, 14 Replacement.) Old Forge processed 13,561 permits (9,119 Preseason, 2,869 Seasonal, 140 Weekday, 1,288 Weekly, 44 Upgrade, 101 Replacement.) Old Forge Camping Resort processed 30 permits (17 Seasonal, 13 Weekly.) Water's Edge processed 58 permits (30 Seasonal, 6 Weekday, 22 Weekly.) Starting March 1, anyone who purchases a permit for 22/23 at the preseason rate of \$80 will also be given a permit to ride out the rest of this season. **I am still hoping Inlet might be able to offer an online shopping cart for snowmobile permits. I am also hoping that Webb and Inlet will get together after the season is over to discuss the whole permit program. There is much in this program that is broken (not just Filemaker), and I am hoping we can work together to fix it for all involved – sellers, purchasers, groomers, enforcers, etc.**
3. During February 2022, \$0 was collected towards the **summer concert series**; and was given to the clerk to be deposited into the Publicity account 6410.412.
4. During February 2022, \$90 was collected for Arts in the Park and \$55 was collected for Fall Festival. A total of \$145 was deposited into the Concessions Account 2024.000. At the end of February there was 26 spaces available for "Arts in the Park" and 23 spaces available for Fall Festival (including 2 food and 2 non-profit.) Applications are available and can be found online at [www.inletartsinthepark.com](http://www.inletartsinthepark.com) and [www.inletfallfestival.com](http://www.inletfallfestival.com).
5. **The IABA's next regular meeting will be Tuesday, March 1<sup>st</sup> meeting will be at the Inlet Public Library. April's meeting will probably be at Screamen Eagle and I am still looking for locations for November & December.** There currently are 110 paid members, with 69 of them paid for 2022. Dues can be paid online at [www.goinletny.com](http://www.goinletny.com), sent in by mail, or dropped off in person to my office.
6. I will continue to try and keep **Inlet's Update Page** [www.inletny.com/inlet/inlets-covid-19-updates](http://www.inletny.com/inlet/inlets-covid-19-updates) updated with information about who's open.
7. Inlet's 20<sup>th</sup> annual **Frozen Fire & Lights** was a tremendous success! New this year was ice sculptures and outhouse, which we plan to do both again next year. Full report available upon request.
8. **Inlet will have a float in Old Forge's St. Patrick's Day Promenade** on Friday, March 18. Parade starts at 5:00 p.m.
9. Brittany will be attending the **Adirondack Sports Expo in Saratoga Springs** on March 19 & 20. She will have a booth set up representing Inlet and any Inlet area business is welcome to send brochures or similar information for her to hand out.
10. The **Shirt Design Contest** only had two entries this year, so both are posted on Inlet's Facebook page and the one with the most likes at 9:00 p.m. on March 25<sup>th</sup> will be the front of this year's shirt. The deadline to be listed on this year's shirt is also March 25<sup>th</sup>. **RESOLUTION NO.**

**REQUESTING AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT TO POST WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS ON TOWN ROADS FOR THE YEAR 2022**

WHEREAS, Vehicle and Traffic Law Article 41, Section 1660 gives authority to the Town Board to post weight limits on Town Roads when the Board deems necessary to protect roads from harm during spring break up, and

WHEREAS, Vehicle and Traffic Law Article 40, Section 1650 gives authority to the county superintendent of highways to post weight limits on County Roads when the superintendent deems it necessary to protect County roads from harm during spring break up, and

WHEREAS, the Town would need to place an ad in the local newspaper notifying the public of such postings, and

WHEREAS, the County Superintendent places a legal ad in the local newspaper notifying the public of such posting on County highways, and

WHEREAS, the Town roads are typically posted for the same duration as the County roads, and

WHEREAS, the Town Board and Town Highway Superintendent believes that it would be in the interest of the Town if the County Superintendent post weight restrictions on the Town roads in conjunction with the County Roads during spring break up, be it
