Supervisor Frey opened the meeting at 7:30 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance.

## PUBLIC HEARING REMAINS OPEN

Supervisor Frey: "thank you everybody for coming I like to see so many people in the Audience. I'd like to remind everybody that the public hearing and the short-term rental regulations is still open if anybody wants to say anything on the short-term rental regulations and at any time during the meeting if you raise your hand during the public comment or now if you'd like. It remains open."

MINUTES REVIEW Supervisor asked if everybody had a chance to review the clerk's minutes from the May 9th meeting anybody have any requests for corrections/ additions. If not, these are the Clerk's minutes.

first public comment: "thank you somebody raised their hand" ... Dennis Hudson spoke:

"I want to say thanks to the community, Adele probably I'm sure has named every single business interview person that has helped with the black fly challenge we had another amazing and successful race and I especially want to thank the public safety people that were involved starting with State Police the sheriff's office in Hamilton County the Fire and Fire policemen from Indian Lake Fire anything like EMS Blue Mountain EMS and then coming over to us it was a great effort by EMS. Lots of great work with a small amount of ambulances in our rescue. I know we're out there and then coming over to the Inlet Police Department excellent we had helped from almost all the officers, and they did a great job and then ending with LifeNet who offered to stand by. but also to be two or three minutes from anywhere in the race and fortunately we didn't need them but it was great to have them there I think they'd like to come back again whether they hand out water bottles and keychains and something but again there's numerous people to thank but I just wanted to thank my crew and of course the ham radio

operators which there was almost 50 operators out in the field given reports and giving safety updates." SUPERVISOR FREY: "Thank you once again to Town of Webb, who loaned us their Band Shell you know the community Spirit on this all the way is awesome just beyond awesome and if anybody wants to help cook burgers in the future I've done that in the past the weight loss uh plan was in full effect with the heat that day and the steam coming off that Grill I don't think I've seen Herb sweat that much in quite a few years...Councilman Schmid said "I was sweating that much an hour ago I wasn't there an hour ago" Supervisor Frey said, but as Dennis said just the support from everybody was phenomenal and if you weren't up there, I was up there briefly but it just was amazing to see that Park used like that absolutely amazing to see it used like that". "Any other public comment? Connie?"

Connie Perry spoke about another energy audit opportunity for town residents. If the Climate Smart Task Force can get 10 people in the area to participate in this audit, it would lead to an additional \$10,000 grant. Supervisor Frey asked if there was a time limit and Connie didn't think so, however, the money could run out. Connie spoke regarding another energy savings opportunity that would allow another \$5,000. They are currently still looking at other options that would allow for this grant.

Supervisor Frey asked if there were any additional comments from the public. Joe Spilka asked if there was an overwhelming demand to move forward with all the points of the changes presented in the short-term local law. "yeah just so I can make the minutes or whatever and understand on the short-term rental thing I have no problem with the current system, I'm against the moratorium aspect of it I'm in favor of the current rules going out town wide.... Unless there is something I am missing, if there is a problem currently, it is an isolated incident. I mean, I understand that it would make Aimee busier and the money thing.... I spoke with a few people on the board, I've done a lot of emails and things like that. I got the impression that if there is an overwhelming demand by the people of the town, the voters and taxpayers.... most people that I've talked to were kind of pretty shocked about the moratorium. I want to hear the opinion of the Board. Joe Spilka added that he does not want to be forgotten. Supervisor Frey stated that we should poll the Board.

Supervisor Frey added: "I just read one last night on New Zealand where a poor woman might lose her rental because of the oppressive things that are happening there, the arguments go both ways.

Assessor Aimee VanWie added that the reason why she was for the changes to the short-term rental law was in large, because she would like to see it town wide. She added that the other restrictions came out to protect the future of rentals.

Councilman Schmid agreed that he would like to see it town wide, however, was not for the moratorium or anything intrusive.

Councilman Levi stated that he respects the Planning Board and appreciates they are looking to the future, and doesn't disagree that it should be town wide, however, the housing issue has always been here, and it was even when he was young. He added that he is not "in love" with the moratorium.

Councilman Townsend spoke, stated that he too is in favor of it being town wide. Originally was against the moratorium, however, is having second thoughts because of "I do witness, working on places, that there is a person they just bought their third house just to rent you know so they've got two that they rent and one that they stay in once in a while."

PLANNING BOARD – Adele spoke regarding the Public Hearing meeting held Memorial Day Weekend. She said it was a great meeting, however, there was not a lot of the public there and may need another public meeting. She added that they are working with the attorneys on the changes and the moratorium is something they are looking at more closely. Dennis Hudson added that there are several meetings, and the public is welcome, therefore, there are plenty of opportunities to be heard. Discussion on when a good date to hold another public hearing and the next Planning Board. June 28 will be the next Planning Board meeting. July 22<sup>nd</sup> at 3:00 pm with the next Public Hearing. The hope is that before Columbus Day something can be adopted.

COMMUNICATIONS: Supervisor Frey reported that Communications had a tower committee Zoom meeting. "There's lots happening and then there's very little that isn't happening but the very little that isn't happening is National Grid still not signing a contract to run power up the hill. The thing that is happening is Tarpon has received delivery of the branches for the towers. The county is sitting on equipment to put on the tower Tarpon hasn't optimistic Outlook of possibly September for turning one or two of the cell sites on the tower. That's still relying on National Grid doing what they said they were going to do, which means not allowing Tarpon or us to hire a contractor to dig a trench and bury the cable. That means National Grid hiring a subcontractor that we could also hire but they won't allow us to hire to dig and bury a cable and then National Grid has to be here to inspect their own subcontractor every inch of the way all the way up the hill and we have to hope that they still have Transformers in stock to place as they go up the hill. It's a very long run from Limekiln Lake Road up to the top of course on the hill. Good news this afternoon the county has found us a generator that's actually in stock that we can use until we get another generator. It's 25 KW. I'm hoping that it's going to be enough and will be rated enough to run our equipment and the shelter that we don't have. We received no bids when we went out for shelter. We just heard back from the northern borders people, and they will not allow us to purchase a used shelter and will not allow us to purchase a used generator. Currently using a free used generator. I knew that was going to happen. As of this morning we're still searching for any state bid on a shelter that would have all the equipment in it but we're not going to wait to see if one falls in our lap, we're going out to bid immediately on constructing our own shelter on site. We also talked with Tarpon and Tarpon is.

going to lay all the or hopefully lay all the conduit and pour the concrete while they're up doing the concrete work for ATT and T-Mobile for our shelter and Generator so that we don't have to go back and reinvent that later. Unless we don't get bids in on constructing our own shelter to spec. I'm hopeful that we could follow the same timeline as Tarpon on the cell sites next fall."

DEPARTMENTS:

"All right we already covered planning board, assessor/codes, Parks dept and Information Office is attached to the agenda. We are also lucky enough to have Mike from Park's here.

PARKS:

Mike Bartolotti said: "We're just keeping busy getting ready for summer got all our benches out and it's been a long time setting up for the black fly challenge. I really want to thank Stephen Cole and John Rouse Memorial Day weekend. Patrick and I got, I'll say, stuck at the Big Moose fire and without even calling or asking, John and Stephen just came in and did our morning routine for us, which was awesome and I really appreciate that. Other than that we're just gonna keep working on getting the beach all set up opened....still working on the ball field. I've had a real problem this year with weeds. We're doing everything we can to get rid of them before we put the clay down. Would still like to get with Shawn at some point to rework our parking area back here. We just have more employees and more vehicles now and it's going to become an issue especially during summer when some have to park out front, which takes out those spots for the tourists. Me and Patrick were able to get back there and grade things down a little bit better, but it would be nice if we could maybe bring in some stone at some point just to increase our parking area a little bit more. I know Shawn's been super busy and hopefully at some point we can get together and figure that out. It has been long overdue. We could use that space no doubt. I mean we have so more room back there and it's kind of just dead space so we might as well make it look nice and take advantage of it.

INFORMATION OFFICE:

Adele spoke: "I just want to say again thank you to the highway department, Park's department, and everybody else that was involved in the Black Fly challenge. It's not in my report yet but it will be.... there were a thousand bikers registered 875 started and 861 finished. That's a pretty small Dropout for a big race like that but everything went well thank you to Town of Webb for the band shell, to Parks, Mike and Patrick. Everyone helped out and it was awesome and looked really good. It was so cool to see all those spectators all lined up at the fence" Dennis added that he forgot to thank the Park's Department. Everything looked awesome. Supervisor Frey stated that he went the next day to the Park and you couldn't even tell there were 3,000 people there.

ASSESSOR/CODES – Aimee reported that the building permits are picking up. The new Williamson Law software is excellent, and everything will be online. It now takes about 5 minutes to issue permits. Grievance day was busier than usual, and she knew it would be.

Waiting to hear back from Gina.

#### COMMUNITY SOLAR AGREEMENT

There is an agreement attached to the agenda on page 10. Dan Kieferbach spoke: "I'll say that that Community Solar is the terminology for this type of agreement between this type of company and municipalities and subscribers for National Grid and other other electric providers in the State of New York. So you know as sort of as an organization in literary Community task force, we're encouraged by this type of program." It was recommended though that an attorney look at any agreements the Town of Inlet looks to enter into. Dan did add that this program opens up further possible grants and is considered a high impact action item. He also pointed out some concerning parts of the contract, such as the exit program and length of commitment. The positive is that it could lead to 8-10% reduction in costs.

SUMMER STAFFING: "You heard Mike say we have one lifeguard right now. If anybody knows anybody that's even interested in doing lifeguarding at this point, I believe we'd be open to pay to have them certified and the pay depending on their age and if they've got any experience, is decent pay because we have to afford to pay the lifeguards a little bit more because they're not a year-round employee or not getting health benefits. They can sign up for New York State retirement that doesn't mean that they're going to be paying an awful lot into it but we're flexible. We need to get the Beach open."

Supervisor Frey mentioned "we do have an executive session after the next public comment and it may be a rather lengthy discussion just so everybody knows. But we will be paying bills when we come back out of that session."

**PUBLIC COMMENT:**

Dan Kieferbach: "There's two Grant rounds upcoming. There's the two thousand dollars for correspondent and then there's the Adirondack Regional Grant, both are due on June 30th excuse me First Responders due June 30th and the regional backgrounds through July 31st....for instance Old Forge fire department is putting into the first spotted Grant round towards GIS equipment or the rescue boat. So, I would love to put in something for the inlet volunteer Emergency Services. Again, these are no match grants you know very simple Grant applications. So please see me. I'll help you do it I really want to put something in and the same thing for the Regional Grant round. Just to give you an idea Old Forge is going to be putting in a grant for Mobile Beach wheelchairs to allow folks that are handicapped to access and go swimming at the beach...I'll help you put it together but if you've got some ideas as to what the town is after you know I can help you with that. Mike gave me a quote. We were talking more in the \$50, 000 range"

Connie Perry spoke: Everybody has been working hard on the Community Garden. It looks great and Stephen has really taken over taking care of it all. You can adopt areas as your own. Many people have stepped up to help and she appreciates it all.

1. Balance in **Petty Cash** on June 30 was \$53.92.
2. From April 1, 2023 to June 30, 2023 this office processed 0 **snowmobile permits** for the 2023/24 season. 2023/24 permits at the preseason rate of \$80 will continue until November 15, 2023. **I am glad the Town of Webb & Town of Inlet are working together to come up with a better program to process the snowmobile permits. It would be nice to see the boards get together once a year – or twice, once in Webb and once in Inlet – to talk about more than just snowmobile trails.**
3. During June 2023, \$600 was collected towards the **summer concert series**; and was given to the clerk to be deposited into the Publicity account 6410.412.
4. During June 2023, \$945 was collected and deposited into the **Concessions Account** 2024.000.
5. **The** IABA's June 6 meeting started at Inlet Town Hall as a bag stuffing for Black Fly Challenge, then moved over to Screamen Eagle. July 5 will be at The Little Fox. August 16 will be at Great Camp Sagamore. Reminder – **You do not need to be a member to attend these meetings. You also do not need to live in Inlet, nor do you need to own a business. All are welcome!** Dues can be paid online at [www.goinletny.com](http://www.goinletny.com), sent in by mail, or dropped off in person to my office.
6. The **Black Fly Challenge** was fantastic! 875 racers started and 861 finished within the 5-hour time limit.
