**Regular Meeting  
May 8, 2024  
Inlet Town Board**

The Regular Meeting was called to order by Supervisor Frey, at 7:30 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Present were: Assessor Aimee VanWie, IT, Dennis Hudson, Tourism Director Adele Burnett, Highway Superintendent Shawn Hansen, Codes/Zoning John Rouse, Parks Supervisor Mike Bartolotti, Steven Young, Jennifer Blakeman, Stephen Cole, Tom Greco, Gordy Rudd, Joanne Meneilly, Amy Townsend, Robin Hill, John Kalil, Jr., Chief Ron Johnston, Leo Fadell, Linda Fadell, Peggy Brownell and Connie Perry.

Brian Buzby with Ampion, VIA ZOOM.

Official's present were Supervisor Frey, Councilman Levi, Councilman Townsend, Councilman, Councilman Brownsell and Town Clerk Yvonne Lutz.

**MINUTES REVIEW** – Supervisor Frey asked if there were any additions or corrections to the April meeting minutes. Councilman Levi pointed out that the information should reflect that the Webb share of the snowmobile permit is 86%, instead of 14%. 14% is Inlet's share.

**PUBLIC COMMENT –**

**GOLF COURSE** - Gordy Rudd asked if there is any word on what is happening yet with the golf course. Supervisor Frey stated that the last conversation he had with Roger, Jr. was that there were no credible offers at this time. There was discussion of them possibly taking care of the back nine holes with the possibility of developing the front nine holes into some kind of housing. He added that he is not looking to lease it. He feels that there isn't anyone right now, including the Town, that is a position to run the golf course. Councilman Townsend added that they have been mowing and working at the golf course, so maintenance seems to be kept up with. Discussion followed.

**SNOWMOBILE PERMITS AND REVENUE** – Peggy Brownell said that she was concerned that a decision without board approval was made regarding the snowmobile permit program going free and where would the lack of revenue come from. It was explained that the Board all supported this decision, and that Supervisor Frey is working on draft budgets that will reflect the lack of revenue from the snowmobile permits. It was added that the Town of Inlet is NOT suing for the money owed to the Town of Inlet from the Town of Webb. The Inlet Board is asking for the money and that the agreement was implied. Town of Inlet was still under the assumption of the standing agreement and the permits continued to reflect a relationship, as Town of Inlet was reflected on the permit sold. Councilman Schmid added that the Board was 100% behind the decision to go free and felt there was no other way to go in the light of things. Schmid added that at this point, we are only looking for the last two years' money from Town of Webb and we will then sever any agreement at this point. Joanne Meneilly asked if there have been discussions between the two towns regarding everything and Councilman Schmid stated they have had discussions, emails and phone calls regarding everything. At least 90% of the money that the Town of Inlet receives from snowmobiling goes back to snowmobiling. Joanne asked if Town of Inlet was totally done with the Town of Webb regarding the snowmobile relationship. Supervisor Frey stated that he felt they were done and per the two emails that Supervisor Baker sent, one that nobody received, they were the party to sever the relationship.

**PICKLEBALL** – Peggy asked if there was any word on the grant for a new pickleball court. Mike Bartolotti stated that the Fern Park master plan is being worked on, which will help for the grants, as they want a plan in writing. The pickleball court is part of the master plan. There was discussion about painting the lines again on the tennis court for pickleball. Peggy stressed that the town is missing out by not having

them. Mike added that the cost is just too high without some grant money available. He stated again that the Wadas grant was extremely helpful in the playground, or we could never have afforded that.

**AMPION** – Brian Buzby was present VIA Zoom for any questions regarding the program. The Town’s accounts have gone “live” now and will start to see all of the benefits soon, if not already. The Town has reached 10 subscribers to meet the first goal and Ampion is running out of capacity for residential customers. They do have more “room” for commercial subscribers. There was discussion on doing some networking with small businesses to get into the solar power program. Discussion followed. The program is ongoing, and the Town will receive ongoing discounts and incentives. Anyone interested in the program should make contact with Brian Buzby, Connie Perry, or go online to sign up.

**FERN PARK MASTER PLAN** – A small group had a meeting to discuss the Fern Park Master Plan. Councilman Brownsell spoke quickly about it and stated there are many thoughts and ideas. There is some homework that needs to be done before the next meeting.

#### **COMMUNICATIONS** –

Supervisor Frey reported that the Town of Inlet put an offer on the used equipment shelter at Yates County for \$5,000. Hamilton County will help with moving it to our location. National Grid dropped off equipment to start running electricity. Could not pour pad until we had the shelter size. Emergency communications may not be installed now until September. With all the costs of modifying the shelter, transportation and the purchase, we would be at about \$50,000-\$60,000 as opposed to \$400,000 that was bid on. Robin Hill asked if we needed the funds from the fundraising. If we do, she will just need to show invoices for everything to date. Gordy Rudd asked if there is an emergency generator and Supervisor Frey stated there was.

**PLANNING BOARD** – No updates at this time.

**INFORMATION OFFICE** - Publicity Director, Adele Burnett gave a detailed monthly report attached to the agenda packet and online. In addition, she reported on information for the Memorial Day Parade that will have floats and prizes. They welcome remarks at the parade and Councilman Schmid will speak if Supervisor Frey is unable.

**PARKS DEPARTMENT** – Park’s Supervisor, Mike Bartolotti’s report is attached to the Agenda. Mike stated that he had been extremely busy getting ready for the summer. He stated he is happy with the progress so far and thanked Shawn and the highway guys for all of their help. He is trying to create more permanent parking at Fern Park without giving up any green space. Shawn could possibly measure to see how much gravel is needed. Discussion followed. Mike stated that the playground is awesome and is still getting a climbing wall. He added that the Historical Society Placard on the side of the bathhouse looks great. Robin stated that the playground account remains open.

**ZONING** – In addition to a monthly report attached to the agenda, John Rouse reported that building permits are up about 56%. He added that if he is not in the office, leave a message and he is probably out on inspections.

**ASSESSOR** – In addition to a monthly report attached to the agenda, Aimee reported grievance day hours. In addition she could meet any time, if needed.

Councilman Brownsell spoke and wanted to discuss giving up the State Highway plowing contract. He wants to look at the numbers more closely, however, feels the Town is losing money with the contract. Councilman Schmid felt that when they looked at last year's numbers, it was a loss. Supervisor Frey disagrees. Councilman Schmid added that Shawn has a hard time getting the Highway contract plowing covered with man hours. Supervisor Frey stated that everything would have to be looked at very closely because he feels we would lose employees. Councilman Schmid and Councilman Brownsell disagree and Brownsell added that he has spoke with Shawn about it and Shawn is in favor of giving up the contract. Discussion followed on the pros and cons of giving this up. Councilman Levi agreed that the new State truck is a huge investment and must be looked at in length. Supervisor Frey added that Tracey at the County worked hard to get towns more money in the contract. Councilman Schmid added that we would still be doing the County Roads and the sidewalks. Councilman Townsend wants to see numbers to decide. He agrees with Supervisor Frey that he fears our roads will suffer.

**TRAILS** – Councilman Levi reported that Chip and his crew have been doing a great job and a lot of work widening trails and doing trail work in general. He will need use of a dump truck instead of using his own personal vehicle. Shawn said it is not a problem, he can tell Shawn when he needs it and if it isn't being used, he is welcome to it.

**TOWN CLERK** - The Town Clerk reported revenue for the month of April. Informed the Board that on the discussion, that was tabled, of how much we supported the Maintain the Chain, it was \$1,000. Asked the Board if they would like to support the same amount this year. Councilman Brownsell made a **MOTION** to give a donation to Maintain the Chain in the amount of \$1,000 for the year 2024. Councilman Levi **SECONDED**.

5 AYES 0 NAYS **MOTION CARRIED**

**SUPERVISOR** – Supervisor Frey wanted to clarify a few things on the Snowmobile revenue sharing with Town of Webb. We have sent a letter from Waddie Kalil's office asking for the 2022-23 and 2023-24 monies that are due to Town of Inlet be paid. Councilman Schmid has been talking to Waddie. Waddie and the Town of Webb Attorney have also been talking. There is no threat of a lawsuit at this time, the letter was just stating facts of what was due and a financial obligation on Town of Webb's part. Possibly they felt threatened because the letter came from an attorney, but that was not the intent. Town of Webb cancelled the agreement, not the Town of Inlet. The Board also discussed possibly getting out a quick letter to the Town of Webb explaining our position and intent. Amy Townsend added that it is a great idea, however, will the Town of Webb even entertain any conversation being that we announced that the permit will be free in the Town of Inlet. The Town of Inlet is working on a street light upgrade to LED. The Board will have to get together and do a survey of what is definitely needed.

**PUBLIC COMMENT** – Joanne Meneilly asked if the Town Board will continue to meet on Wednesday nights instead of Tuesdays? Councilman Schmid said he is "not excited" about Wednesdays but the discussion following determined that Wednesdays allow the Town of Inlet Board to attend the Town of Webb meetings to stay informed as to what is going on in that community. At this time, we will try Wednesdays and it will be the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday of the month until further notice, if needed. Joanne Meneilly added that she did not see any adequate posting about the meeting change because she does not do anything online. Town Clerk apologized and noted this.

Councilman Brownsell thanked Tom Greco for standing up for what is right with his Board. Councilman Greco added he doesn't understand how it got to this and that we are connected in so many ways. The meeting in May was arranged to show how we could work together on this. He doesn't understand how they got to the \$50,000. Greco also added he thinks it is thought that Inlet gets 14% in addition to what Inlet collects, however, that is incorrect. Inlet gets 14% of total revenue, less expenses. He feels so strongly that he wants the two towns to work together. He asked the Inlet Board if we are pursuing litigation and the Inlet Board stressed again that it is not the Town of Inlet's desire to do any legal recourse, and also would like to work together. Greco asked the Board that if Town of Webb paid what is owed, what would the Inlet Board require to move forward? Councilman Schmid gave TOW Councilman Greco a lot of credit for standing for what is right. Supervisor Frey added that the Town of Inlet offered to pay for new software to make the permit program more user friendly and as a peace offering back when we were offered only \$50,000. The Town of Inlet was not in agreement of the \$50,000, however, offered to buy the software so Inlet could help with more processing. Greco added that it doesn't and shouldn't have anything to do with the amount of processing. With the new program, Inlet has processed significantly more. Supervisor Frey added that we have always wanted a good relationship with Town of Webb. Aimee helps down there in the assessing office, and we always have Inlet Police respond to the public needs. Supervisor Frey added that he respects TOW Councilman Greco for coming.

**TOWNSEND TRAIL** – Peggy stated that the trail looks great and when more will be done and when repairs will be done. The Town Clerk was asked to answer. There are two easements that hold out on signing and will not allow us to proceed from Payne’s Seaplane base to Seventh Lake House. Have not approached the families in a while if they would be willing to sign, maybe that could be done.

Connie Perry and Mike have talked about the mini-splits and thought maybe the money from the grants could be used on a generator for the post office building. The door has to be propped open when there is a power outage and the winter months are extremely cold causing problems. Discussion followed on how the grant money can be used and other options were discussed.

**SNOWMOBILE RACE** – Councilman Levi was approached by an organization asking if the Town of Inlet would be supportive of a snowmobile race in the area. The Board was intrigued by the idea and felt they would be willing to support an event. John Kalil spoke that they are the ADK Cross Country Race Series. They have these events across the states in ADK Communities. They also contacted McCauley and they didn’t seem to be interested in the event. Kalil added that, if done right, it could bring a lot to the area.

**COMMUNITY GARDEN** - Stephen has been working hard on getting the community garden set up and running.  
Connie Perry thanked Bonnie for her help with grant information.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION** - Councilman Schmid made a MOTION to move into Executive Session at 9:15 pm, Councilman Levi **SECONDED**.

**REGULAR SESSION** - Councilman Schmid made a MOTION to move into Regular Session at 9:30 pm with a decision to be prepared for legal support on a legal issue. Councilman Townsend **SECONDED**.

A **MOTION** to pay highway bills as presented was made by Councilman Levi, **SECONDED** by Councilman Brownsell.

5 AYES 0 NAYS **MOTION CARRIED**

A **MOTION** to pay General/Wastewater bills presented was made by Councilman Levi **SECONDED** by Councilman Townsend.

5 AYES 0 NAYS **MOTION CARRIED**

All business having come before this Board, Councilman Townsendi made the **MOTION** to adjourn the meeting at 9:30 pm. Councilman Levi **SECONDED**. Next meeting will be held June 12, 2024, at 7:30 pm.
